New Franklin Woman Sentenced to 6 Years in Prison for Crash Which Killed Two Teens

AKRON, Ohio (Friday, June 15, 2018) – Summit County Prosecutor Sherri Bevan Walsh announced today that Summit County Common Pleas Court Judge Paul Gallagher sentenced Natasha Boggs, 25, of Weaver Road in New Franklin, to six years in prison for a deadly crash that killed two teens and left a third seriously injured.

On March 30, 2018, Boggs pled guilty to the following charges:

- Two Counts of Involuntary Manslaughter – felonies of the 3rd degree
- Vehicular Assault – a felony of the 4th degree
- Attempted Tampering with Evidence – a felony of the 4th degree

“This Defendant cost two very young people their lives and seriously injured a third. I hope this sentence brings some solace to the families for this horrific tragedy,” said Prosecutor Walsh.

On May 28, 2017, Boggs was driving on South Main Street in Coventry Township when she drove outside of the marked lane of the road, over a curb onto the grass striking three teens. 14-year-old Taylor Galloway of Akron, and 14-year-old Amber Thoma of Coventry Township, died. A 15-year-old was hospitalized with serious injuries.
