Munroe Falls Man Sentenced for Bomb Threat

AKRON, Ohio (Tuesday, April 14, 2015) – Summit County Prosecutor Sherri Bevan Walsh announced today that Michael Nicodemus, 20, of Cheltenham Lane in Munroe Falls, was sentenced to three and a half years in prison for inducing panic, a felony of the second degree, and making false alarms, a felony of the third degree.

On May 24, 2013, Nicodemus made a bomb threat to Cuyahoga Falls High School. Nicodemus was indicted on October 31st, 2014 and pled guilty on March 9th, 2015 to the charges.

Prosecutor Walsh says "we cannot tolerate threats made against our schools and our children. The Cuyahoga Falls police department spent thousands of dollars investigating this threat. School was forced to evacuate and the community had to deal this scare."

Judge Christine Croce sentenced Nicodemus to two years in the Ohio Department of Corrections for the inducing panic charge, and 18 months in the Ohio Department of Corrections for making false alarms. The sentences are to be served consecutively. Nicodemus was also ordered to pay \$13,000 in restitution to the Cuyahoga Falls police department.

Nicodemus apologized for making the threat.
