Akron Man Found Guilty of Breaking Into Home in 2010

AKRON, Ohio (Friday, December 08, 2017) – Summit County Prosecutor Sherri Bevan Walsh announced today that a Summit County jury found Phil D. Mills, 34, of East York Street in Akron, guilty of breaking into a home in July of 2010.

Jurors found Mills guilty of the following charges:

- Aggravated Burglary with a Gun Specification – a felony of the 1st degree
- Aggravated Robbery with a Gun Specification – a felony of the 1st degree
- Having a Weapon While Under Disability – a felony of the 3rd degree

In July of 2010, the victim entered his Akron home and found a man wearing a mask ransacking the bedroom. The suspect pointed a gun at the victim, and then ran off. A mask was found a few blocks away. Investigators eventually matched DNA found in the mask to Mills and a grand jury indicted Mills in 2016. Mills also served time in prison from 2011-2014 for aggravated robbery.

Summit County Common Pleas Court Judge Jill Flagg Lanzinger is scheduled to sentence Mills on January 16, 2018 at 1pm.
