Prison for Thieving Couple

(August 13, 2014... Akron) ... Summit County Prosecutor Sherri Bevan Walsh announced today that Judge Lynne Callahan sentenced Carol Ann Hulett and her husband Shaun, both 36 and living on Sobul Avenue in Akron, to prison.

After learning that a developmentally disabled man frequently rode the bus with her husband, Carol pretended to also be disabled and befriended the man. She convinced him to cash three paychecks and give her the money. Carol and Shaun also stole checks from the home of an elderly gentleman when they visited his home. Carol forged two of the stolen checks.

Finally, Shaun stole a purse from a woman at the Barley House on Main Street in Akron on July 28. Mayor Don Plusquellic was at the bar at the time and chased Shaun. Akron police officers caught Shaun on South Arlington.

Today Shaun pleaded guilty to Burglary, a felony of the third degree, and was sentenced to two years in prison. Carol pleaded guilty to Burglary, a felony of the third degree; Theft from the Disabled, a felony of the fifth degree; and Forgery, a felony of the fifth degree. She was sentenced to four years in prison on those charges, plus another nine months for violating the terms of her community control on a prior case.
