Akron Teen Sentenced to 14 Years on Two Separate Cases

AKRON, Ohio (Thursday, May 19, 2016) – Summit County Prosecutor Sherri Bevan Walsh announced today that Summit County Common Pleas Court Judge Tammy O'Brien sentenced David Quarterman, 19, of Edmeyer Court in Akron, to 14 years in prison for his role in two separate cases, including the shooting death of a 17-year-old.

On February 19, 2016, Quarterman pled guilty to the following charges:

- Complicity to Commit Voluntary Manslaughter – a felony of the 1st degree
- Aggravated Robbery – a felony of the 1st degree

In February of 2015, Quarterman was walking down an alley toward Colfax Place in Akron with two other teens, 19-year-old Marcus Price and 17-year-old Ahmed Hill. Eyewitnesses said they heard several gunshots and saw two men running from the scene. Police arrived and found Hill shot twice in the head.

A Summit County jury found Price guilty of Tampering with Evidence. Price was sentenced on May 18, 2016 to three years in prison.

In the other case, Quarterman admitted to robbing three men at an Akron home, shooting one of the victims in the leg. His 18-year-old brother Davaughn is currently facing charges of Aggravated Burglary, Aggravated Robbery, and Felonious Assault in the case.
