Akron Man Sentenced to 18 Years in Prison for Abducting & Shooting Ex-Girlfriend

AKRON, Ohio (Wednesday, July 19, 2017) – Summit County Prosecutor Sherri Bevan Walsh announced today that Summit County Common Pleas Court Judge Christine Croce sentenced Terrence Robinson-Bey, 54, of Rosemary Boulevard in Akron, to 18 years in prison for abducting and shooting his ex-girlfriend.

On June 22, 2017, a Summit County jury found Robinson-Bey guilty of the following charges:

- Felonious Assault with a Gun Specification – a felony of the 2nd degree
- Abduction with a Gun Specification – a felony of the 3rd degree
- Having a Weapon Under Disability – a felony of the 3rd degree

Judge Croce also determined Robinson-Bey is a Repeat Violent Offender.

In April of 2015, Robinson-Bey was driving around with his ex-girlfriend when the two got into an argument. Robinson-Bey then shot the 41-year-old woman in the leg as she tried to jump from the vehicle. Robinson-Bey forced the woman back in the car, drove around for hours while she was injured, and refused to take her to the hospital. Eventually, he drove her to a family member's home where the victim was able to escape. The woman was taken to the hospital, where she was treated for her injuries.
