Akron Man Sentenced to 12 Years in Prison for Bar Shooting

AKRON, Ohio (Wednesday, October 05, 2016) – Summit County Prosecutor Sherri Bevan Walsh announced today that Marcell Williams, 22, of Chalker Street in Akron, was sentenced to 12 years in prison for shooting two men outside an Akron bar.

On August 19, 2016 Williams pled guilty to the following charges:

- Two Counts of Felonious Assault with a Firearm Specification – felonies of the 2nd degree
- Having a Weapon Under Disability – a felony of the 3rd degree

In the early morning hours of January 24, 2016, a fight broke out at the PK Lounge on North Howard Street in Akron. One of the bar's bouncers kicked out all those involved in the fight. Once outside, Williams attempted to punch the bouncer when another fight started. Williams eventually went to a vehicle in the parking lot and got a gun. Williams waited for the bouncer to return and then shot him several times. One of the shots intended for the bouncer struck another man in the foot. Williams has prior convictions for domestic violence and having a weapon under disability.
