### **Akron Man Receives Maximum Sentence in Deadly Crash**

AKRON, Ohio (Tuesday, May 19, 2015) – Summit County Prosecutor Sherri Bevan Walsh announced today that David Brown, 40, of Casterton Avenue in Akron, was sentenced to five years in prison, the maximum allowed, and had his driver's license suspended for life, for driving under the influence and causing a deadly crash.

On April 13, 2015, Brown pled guilty to Aggravated Vehicular Homicide, a felony of the third degree, and Driving Under the Influence, a misdemeanor of the first degree.

"This is a tragedy which could have been avoided. Mr. Brown chose to drink alcohol and get behind the wheel of his car," said Prosecutor Walsh. "And his actions led to the death of someone who had the rest of their life ahead of them. I hope this sentence sends a message to not drink and drive."

On the morning of July 12, 2014, Brown was driving on I-77 South when he struck another vehicle from behind, causing the other car to flip. 18-year-old Andrew Moncheck, a recent graduate of Stow-Munroe Falls High School, was ejected from the vehicle and died from his injuries.
