### **Akron Man Pleads Guilty in Connection with Deadly Shooting** *Harold Burros Sentenced to LIFE IN PRISON*

AKRON, Ohio (Tuesday, April 30, 2019) – Summit County Prosecutor Sherri Bevan Walsh announced today that Harold Burros, 27, of Moore Street in Akron, pled guilty in connection with the shooting death of 18-year-old Brandon Belleville in September of 2017.

Summit County Common Pleas Court Judge Alison McCarty immediately sentenced Burros to LIFE IN PRISON. Burros will be eligible for parole after serving 23 years of his sentence.

Burros pled guilty to the following charges:

- Aggravated Murder with a Gun Specification – a Special Felony
- Aggravated Robbery with a Gun Specification – a felony of the 1<sup>st</sup> degree

On September 19, 2017, Burros and three other men kicked in the front door of Belleville's Minerva Place home and shot him several times. Belleville died from his injuries.

Two of the other men, 26-year-old Lamar Jackson of Hartford Avenue in Akron, and 18-year-old CQuincey Chatman of Blanche Street in Akron, pled guilty on Monday April 29, 2019 in connection with the deadly shooting

Jackson and Chatman pled guilty to the following charges:

- Involuntary manslaughter with a Gun Specification – a felony of the 1<sup>st</sup> degree
- Aggravated Robbery with a Gun Specification – a felony of the 1<sup>st</sup> degree

Chatman was a juvenile at the time of the shooting. His case was transferred to the Summit County Court of Common Pleas from Juvenile Court.

Judge McCarty is scheduled to sentence Jackson and Chatman on May 22, 2019 at 2:30pm.

Akron Police are actively searching for the fourth suspect in the case.
