Akron Man Pleads Guilty to Shooting Girlfriend Multiple Times

AKRON, Ohio (Friday, May 05, 2017) – Summit County Prosecutor Sherri Bevan Walsh announced today that Jamarian Williams, 26, of Roslyn Avenue in Akron, pled guilty to the 14 count indictment for shooting his girlfriend, Bianca Haskell, multiple times.

Williams pled guilty to the following charges:

- Attempted Murder with a Gun Specification – a felony of the 1st degree
- Four Counts of Felonious Assault with Gun Specifications – felonies of the 2nd degree
- Domestic Violence – a felony of the 3rd degree
- Having a Weapon Under Disability – a felony of the 3rd degree
- Tampering with Evidence – a felony of the 3rd degree
- Failure to Comply with Order of a Police Officer – a felony of the 3rd degree
- Receiving Stolen Property – a felony of the 4th degree
- Improper Handling of a Firearm in a Motor Vehicle – a felony of the 4th degree
- Three Counts of Endangering Children – felonies of the 4th degree

On August 31, 2016, Williams shot Haskell on the front porch of Haskell's home. The couple had been in a relationship and had three young children together. All three children were inside the home at the time of the shooting, but none were injured as a result of the shooting. After the shooting, Williams led police on a short chase. During the chase, Williams tossed the gun used in the shooting out of the vehicle's window.

Williams also pled guilty to a community control violation in connection with a case from 2015. Williams was on probation for the 2015 case when he shot Ms. Haskell.

Summit County Common Pleas Court Judge Paul Gallagher is scheduled to sentence Williams on Friday, June 9, 2017 at 9am.
