## Massillon Man Sentenced to 40-to-45.5 Years in Prison In Connection With Four Separate Cases

AKRON, Ohio (Tuesday, November 14, 2023) – Summit County Prosecutor Sherri Bevan Walsh announced today that Summit County Common Pleas Court Judge Alison Breaux sentenced Delbert Rackley, 21, of Harvard Avenue NE in Massillon, to 40-to-45.5 years in prison for his role in four separate gun cases, including one which resulted in the death of a 23-year-old Akron Man.

Prior to sentencing, Rackley pled guilty to the following charges on the separate cases:

- Voluntary Manslaughter with a Gun Specification a Felony of the 1<sup>st</sup> Degree
- Five Counts of Felonious Assault with Gun Specifications Felonies of the 2<sup>nd</sup> Degree
- Three Counts of Having a Weapon Under Disability Felonies of the 3<sup>rd</sup> Degree

In July of 2021, close to 200 vehicles were in a parking lot on South Hawkins Avenue in Akron, with people blocking traffic, doing donuts in the parking lot, and drag racing. In the middle of the chaos, Rackley approached 23-year-old Marquis Sams and shot him several times. Sams later died from his injuries. A teenager was also injured in the shooting.

About three weeks prior to the shooting Rackley shot at a party bus while travelling on I-77. Two people on the bus were injured. Another vehicle was struck, but no one inside was hurt.

In the two other separate cases, Akron Police discovered Rackley to be in possession of a gun after officers pulled over a vehicle Rackley was travelling in.
