Akron Teen Sentenced to Minimum of 15 Years for Role in Death of Carlos Godineaux

AKRON, Ohio (Monday, November 25, 2024) – Summit County Prosecutor Elliot Kolkovich announced today that Summit County Common Pleas Judge Jennifer Towell sentenced Jontay Johnson, 19, of Scenic Way in Akron, to a minimum prison term of 15 years for his role in the death of Carlos Godineaux.

Johnson previously pleaded guilty to the following charges:

- Conspiracy to Commit Involuntary Manslaughter a Felony of the 1st Degree
- Conspiracy to Commit Aggravated Robbery a Felony of the 1st Degree
- Having Weapons Under Disability a Felony of the 3rd Degree

In February 2024, Godineaux was shot and killed on Bellevue Avenue near Diagonal Road on Akron's west side. Investigators determined Godineaux went to the area to sell shoes to a person he met through Facebook Marketplace. Evidence and tips led police to Johnson and a 15-year-old. A week after the shooting, Akron Police arrested the 15-year-old. Days later the U.S. Marshals Northern Ohio Violent Fugitive Task Force tracked Johnson down to a location in Canton and took him into custody.

The 15-year-old admitted to one count of murder in juvenile court and is currently committed to the Ohio Department of Youth Services until he is 21.

"This was a senseless tragedy that led to the death of a young father of three," Prosecutor Kolkovich said. "My sympathy goes to the victim's family, and I am thankful that those responsible for his death have been held accountable."
