PROSECUTOR KOLKOVICH ANNOUNCES CONVICTION OF MAJOR DRUG OFFENDER



AKRON, OH – Today, Summit County Prosecutor Elliot Kolkovich announced that Antonio Miller, 33, was found guilty of aggravated trafficking in drugs, and having a firearm while he was under a legal disability. Miller was also designated a Major Drug Offender based on the amount of methamphetamine he trafficked.

Miller pleaded guilty to the following charges:

- One count of Aggravated Trafficking of Drugs – a 1st Degree Felony – with Major Drug Offender and Forfeiture specifications; and

- One count of Having Weapons While Under Disability – a 3rd Degree Felony.

Miller is currently incarcerated for 36 years to life for the 2022 murder of Tina Case, the mother of Danielle Case, who is Miller's former girlfriend and co-defendant in this drug trafficking case. Judge Mary Margaret Rowlands sentenced Miller to a prison term of 11 to 16.5 years for this case.

“Antonio Miller has proven himself to be a danger to the community. Traffickers exploit the addiction of others, and I’m grateful he is off the streets and facing the consequences of his actions. I especially want to thank the Northern Ohio Violent Fugitive Task Force for their efforts in locating Miller,” said Prosecutor Kolkovich.

In May 2021, the Northern Ohio Violent Fugitive Task Force located Antonio Miller at his home he shared with Danielle Case. Miller had several active warrants for his arrest, including warrants for having weapons under disability and for fleeing from police. Upon investigation of the residence, law enforcement found large amounts of narcotics, including 1,380 grams of meth and 428 grams of fentanyl; firearms, including an AK-47 rifle; and \$81,895 in cash.
