PROSECUTOR KOLKOVICH ANNOUNCES PRISON TERM FOR THEFT FROM ELDERLY WOMAN

AKRON, OH – Today, Summit County Prosecutor Elliot Kolkovich announced that Mary Davidson was sentenced yesterday to 2 years in prison for burglarizing the home of an 86-year-old woman in 2024.

In April, Davidson pled guilty to the following charges:

- One count of Burglary a 2nd Degree Felony; and
- One count of Theft From a Person in a Protected Class a 5th Degree Felony.

"Davidson took advantage of a vulnerable member of our community, showing no regard for the safety and dignity of the elderly. I will always fight for the protection of our senior population," said Prosecutor Kolkovich.

In December 2024, Barberton Police were dispatched to a residence on West Park Avenue in response to a reported burglary in progress. The call came from the son of the elderly homeowner, who had installed surveillance cameras inside the house. He informed police that he had observed an unknown woman inside the home, rummaging through his mother's belongings. Upon arrival, officers found Mary Davidson in the hallway. When questioned, Davidson claimed she was there to get groceries for the homeowner and clean her carpets. However, the homeowner stated she had never met Davidson before, and that Davidson had forced her way into the house and stolen jewelry. She also reported that Davidson had done the same thing the previous week. Law enforcement then arrested Davidson for burglary.
