## PROSECUTOR KOLKOVICH ANNOUNCES PRISON TERMS FOR TWO OFFENDERS ENGAGED IN CORRUPT ACTIVITY

AKRON, OH – Today, Summit County Prosecutor Elliot Kolkovich announced that Calvion O'Brian, 35, and James Robinson, 35 – two offenders involved in multiple pharmacy break-ins in 2023 – were each sentenced to four to six years in prison.

O'Brian and Robinson both pleaded guilty to the following charges in March:

- One count of Engaging in a Pattern of Corrupt Activity a 1<sup>st</sup> Degree Felony;
- Two counts of Theft of Drugs a 4<sup>th</sup> Degree Felony; and
- Three counts of Breaking and Entering a 5<sup>th</sup> Degree Felony.

"O'Brian and Robinson not only stole controlled substances from local pharmacies, but also valuable equipment, posing a serious risk to public safety. I want to thank the Twinsburg, Bath, and Fairlawn Police Departments for their collaborative investigative work in this case," said Prosecutor Kolkovich.

In July 2023, a series of pharmacy break-ins occurred in Fairlawn, Bath, and Twinsburg over the course of a single night. Surveillance footage from each scene captured the same vehicle and showed three suspects entering the pharmacies. From the Bath and Twinsburg locations, the suspects stole various narcotics. At the Bath pharmacy, they also took a pill-counting machine valued at approximately \$6,000.

During the investigation, cell phone location records showed that a phone registered to James Robinson had traveled to Fairlawn, Bath, and Twinsburg on the night of the break-ins. Investigators also determined that the vehicle seen in the surveillance footage was a rental car registered under Calvin O'Brian's name. The third suspect remains at large.
