## PROSECUTOR KOLKOVICH ANNOUNCES LIFE SENTENCE FOR MURDER OF GREGORY MCMULLEN

AKRON, OH – Today, Summit County Prosecutor Elliot Kolkovich announced that Dareeque Dorman, 37, was sentenced to life in prison for the 2024 murder of Gregory McMullen inside his residence on Lindsay Avenue in Akron. Dorman will be eligible for parole after 24 years.

In October, a Summit County Jury found Dorman guilty of the following charges:

- One count of Murder an Unclassified Felony;
- Two counts of Felonious Assault a 2<sup>nd</sup> Degree Felony; and
- One count of Tampering with Evidence a 3<sup>rd</sup> Degree Felony.

The Honorable Judge Thomas Teodosio also found Dorman guilty of three Repeat Violent Offender specifications.

"This case is a reminder of how quickly violence can change lives. Gregory was deeply loved, and while no outcome can undo that loss, we hope today offers his family and friends some peace as they begin to heal," said Prosecutor Kolkovich.

In May 2024, Dorman visited Gregory McMullen's residence at Lindsay Avenue in Akron for a social gathering. During the event, Dorman and McMullen became involved in a verbal altercation. The situation escalated when Dorman produced a knife and stabbed the victim in the face, chest, and back, killing him. A portion of the incident was recorded by another party attendee, capturing Dorman visibly holding a knife. Following the stabbing, Dorman fled the scene. Several witnesses stated that they observed Dorman stabbing the victim. Upon being located by police, Dorman denied stabbing the victim and claimed he did not possess a knife.
