PROSECUTOR KOLKOVICH ANNOUNCES AT LEAST 11 YEARS IN PRISON FOR REPEAT MAJOR DRUG OFFENDER



AKRON, OH – Today, Summit County Prosecutor Elliot Kolkovich announced that Rolnathan Bullock, 57, was sentenced to 11 to 16.5 years in prison for drug trafficking charges stemming from 2024. Bullock was also designated a Major Drug Offender for trafficking 313.5 grams of methamphetamine, 146.80 grams of heroin, and 927.44 grams of cocaine. In total, officers recovered 1387.74 grams of trafficked drugs.

In September 2025, Bullock pleaded guilty to the following charges:

- One count of Trafficking in Cocaine with a Major Drug Offender Specification and a Specification for Forfeiture of Money in a Drug Case – a 1st Degree Felony;
- One count of Trafficking in Heroin with a Major Drug Offender Specification and a Specification for Forfeiture of Money in a Drug Case – a 1st Degree Felony;

- One count of Aggravated Trafficking in Drugs with a Major Drug Offender Specification and a Specification for Forfeiture of Money in a Drug Case – a 1st Degree Felony; and
- One count of Having Weapons While Under Disability with a Specification for Forfeiture of a Weapon while under Disability – a 3rd Degree Felony.

“The amount of cocaine Rolnathan Bullock was trafficking is nine times above the threshold needed to be classified as a Major Drug Offender. My office will continue to make clear that Summit County drug traffickers will face justice for pushing these fatal and highly addictive drugs into our communities,” said Prosecutor Kolkovich.

In October 2024, Akron Police Department Narcotics Unit executed a search warrant on Rolnathan Bullock’s business and residence on West Exchange Street in Akron. Officers had previously confirmed that Bullock was operating a drug operation at the address and had staged controlled purchases of cocaine. At the time, Bullock was on probation for an unrelated 2021 drug trafficking conviction. During the search, officers recovered \$3,900 in US currency, a 45-caliber pistol, gun magazine, digital scales, drug packaging materials, a drug press, various bagged substances, 313.5 grams of methamphetamine, 146.80 grams of heroin, and 927.44 grams of cocaine. The threshold required under Ohio law to be classified as a Major Drug Offender for methamphetamine is 300 grams, and 100 grams for cocaine and heroin.
