PROSECUTOR KOLKOVICH ANNOUNCES 9 TO 13.5 YEARS IN PRISON FOR DRUG TRAFFICKER

AKRON, OH – Today, Summit County Prosecutor Elliot Kolkovich announced that Dominique Prince, 34, of Akron, was sentenced to a mandatory 9 to 13.5 years in prison for trafficking meth. In March, Prince pleaded guilty to one count of Aggravated Trafficking in Drugs, a 1st Degree Felony.

“I’d like to thank Akron Narcotic Detectives, Street Narcotics Uniform Detail Detectives, the Violent Fugitive Task Force, and Summit County Drug Unit Detectives for their collaborative effort to bring Dominique Prince into custody. My office does not tolerate those who bring these deadly drugs into our community, and I am glad to see Prince finally face justice,” said Prosecutor Kolkovich.

In September 2025, an Akron detective and K-9 officer intercepted a package at a local shipping company that contained five pounds, or 2,267.96 grams, of Crystal Methamphetamine that was to be delivered to a “Jonathan Garcia” on Jonathan Avenue in Akron. Officers then organized a controlled delivery of 299.83 grams of crystal meth to the resident, who was identified with the use of multiple Law Enforcement databases as Dominique Prince. Prince’s license plate was also registered to the Jonathan Avenue residence. Detectives set up surveillance around the property, monitoring as an undercover Summit County Drug Unit detective delivered the parcel containing the drugs. A different resident associated with Prince accepted the package and a while later, Prince arrived at the residence, obtained the drug parcel and attempted to leave before being arrested by officers. Upon executing a search warrant on the residence, officers recovered methamphetamine and scales in Prince’s bedroom.
