### **PROSECUTOR KOLKOVICH ANNOUNCES 15.5 TO 17 YEARS IN PRISON FOR SHOOTING AT POLICE OFFICERS**

AKRON, OH – Today, Summit County Prosecutor Elliot Kolkovich announced that Calvin Hunt, 46, of Akron, pleaded guilty and was sentenced to 15.5 to 17 years in prison yesterday for shooting at multiple civilians and two police officers on Grant Street.

Hunt pleaded guilty to the following charges:

- One count of Felonious Assault with a 10.5 Year Firearm Specification and a Repeat Violent Offender Specification– a 1<sup>st</sup> Degree Felony;
- One count of Improper Discharge of a Firearm at or into a Habitation – a 2<sup>nd</sup> Degree Felony; and
- One count of Having Weapons While Under Disability – a 3<sup>rd</sup> Degree Felony.

**“I want to thank the officers for their bravery and quick response to a potentially deadly situation. Hunt endangered the lives of innocent civilians, and the officers’ willingness to risk their lives to protect those civilians is the ultimate act of public service,”** said Prosecutor Kolkovich.

At sentencing, the Summit County Prosecutor’s Office recommended a minimum prison term of 30 years. The assigned judge imposed a 15.5-to-17-year sentence.

In May 2025, Akron Police Officers were responding to welfare check when they heard gunshots coming from a nearby apartment building. Officers ran towards the gunshots when an individual ran up to the officers, informing them of an active shooter. Officers then exchanged gunfire with the suspect before the suspect fled the scene. Witness testimony connected Hunt to the shooting.
