Whom Can You Trust?

Kindness, respect, and trust as we all know can go a long way. Unfortunately, some people do not believe in this ideology, even people that we keep closest to us.

Recently, our office has come across alarming cases that have raised questions on whom to trust in this day and age. In December, an elderly woman set down her purse during a Church service to receive communion only to have the purse stolen. The thieves used her funds to buy nearly \$1,000 worth of merchandise from grocery stores. In Akron's Highland Square area, a 14year-old boy was taken into custody after carjacking a man at gunpoint.

In addition to these recent theft cases, we have also come across more disturbing cases. Billy Patterson recently pled guilty to charges of rape, aggravated burglary and felonious assault of a 72-year-old woman. The victim and Billy had known each other for 10 years prior to the crime being committed.

Being aware and knowing that not everyone is as trustworthy as we may want to believe is a necessary precaution we all need to take. Always remember to lock your doors, and put your purse or wallet in a safe place, even while loading groceries into your car. Apparently you have to do this even in church!

Be aware of what is happening around you even during the day.

Identity Theft Warnings/Tips

⇒ Use a shredder to discard important documents with bank account information, passwords, etc.



- ⇒ Only use Credit and Debit Cards at legitimate locations. Be wary of flea markets and local, small market stores. These may not have the protected servers major corporations have.
- \Rightarrow Do not give out passwords and pin pass codes, even to family members, unless you truly trust that person receiving the information.
- \Rightarrow Do not show social security numbers to anyone. This is one of the easiest ways for criminals to gain information about every aspect of your life.
- ⇒ Be careful when using public computers, at the library or community centers. Remember to log out of everything, including your Facebook account. Thieves can gain valuable information through your social media accounts, even if your financial information is not directly on there.

Internet related crimes is one of the fastest growing issues facing the criminal justice system. Don't become the next victim!
