PROSECUTOR KOLKOVICH ANNOUNCES AT LEAST 10 YEARS FOR SHEETZ ROAD RAGE INCIDENT

AKRON, OH – Today, Summit County Prosecutor Elliot Kolkovich announced that Kamar Parham, 22, of Akron, pleaded guilty and was sentenced to 10 to 12 years in prison for his involvement in a road rage incident inside the parking lot of Sheetz on Main Street in Cuyahoga Falls.

Parham pleaded guilty to:

- Three counts of Felonious Assault, each with a 3-Year Firearm Specification – a 2nd Degree Felony; and
- One count of Tampering with Evidence – a 3rd Degree Felony.

“There is no excuse for shooting at someone who is trying to get away from you. Parham’s violent actions endangered not only the victim, but the lives of everyone else nearby. I am grateful that nobody was injured or killed,” said Prosecutor Kolkovich.

In November 2025, Kamar Parham was driving when he became irritated with another driver. The victim, feeling threatened, attempted to lose Parham in traffic; however, Parham followed the victim to a Sheetz parking lot on Main Street in Cuyahoga Falls. Parham positioned his vehicle near the second entrance to the parking lot. As the victim attempted to exit and re-enter the roadway, Parham exited his vehicle and fired six rounds. Several rounds struck the victim’s vehicle, and another struck a bystander’s vehicle. Parham then fled the scene. Through victim and witness statements, along with FLOCK camera footage and vehicle identification, officers identified Parham as the suspect. He later confessed to discharging the firearm and admitted to disposing of the weapon following the incident.

Parham’s co-defendant and passenger in the vehicle, Lashay Jackson, 23, of Akron, is set for trial on August 3, 2026.
